


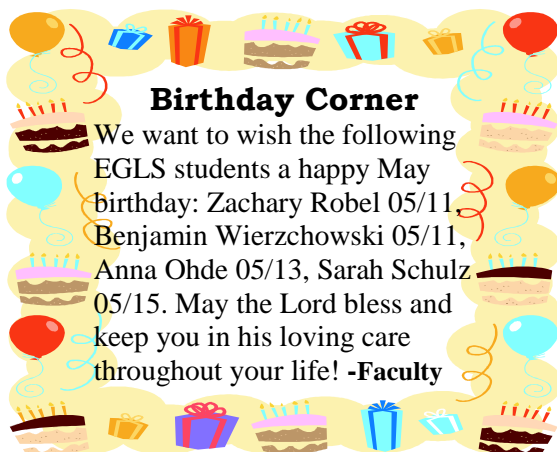

School Baskets: This year we are not doing a basket for each class room but
